ROMANIA

Six migrants die in crash

Six migrants died, while three others and their driver were injured in a vehicle crash near the Black Sea city of Burgas, a senior interior ministry official said on Friday.

The incident occurred a short time before midnight Thursday as police tried to stop a van with Romanian registration plates carrying nine migrants who had entered the country illegally, border police chief Anton Zlatanov told reporters.

He said the driver repeatedly refused to stop at the signals given and, eventually, attempted to evade spike strips set by the police. The van crashed, leading to the six fatalities. The Romanian driver and the three surviving migrants received first aid at the scene.

UK

Lisa apologises for rule breach

Lisa Nandy, the UK's Secretary of State on Friday apologised to Prime Minister Keir Starmer after she was found to have "unknowingly" breached the country's public appointment rules when appointing England's new football watchdog.

The Independent Commissioner for Public Appointments, Sir William Shawcross, concluded in his report that the appointment of David last month breached the governance code as he had made two donations totalling 2,900 pounds to the British Indian minister's Labour leadership campaign five years ago.

"The Commissioner finds that she has unknowingly breached the Code. She should have carried out that check and taken any necessary consequential action before selecting him," Shawcross notes in his findings.

Washington

The Senate was voting on Thursday on a legislation that would check US President Donald Trump's ability to launch an attack against Venezuela, as Democrats pressed Congress to take a stronger role in Trump's high-stakes campaign against Venezuelan President Nicolas Maduro.

Lawmakers, including top Republicans, have demanded that the Trump administration provide them with more information on the US military strikes against alleged drug-smuggling vessels in the Caribbean and eastern Pacific Ocean.

But Thursday's vote, which would essentially forestall an attack on Venezuelan soil by first requiring congressional authorisation, was a significant test of GOP senators' willingness to allow the Trump administration to continue its buildup of naval forces in the region.

"We're tired of Congress abdicating this most solemn power to a president," said Senator Tim Kaine, the Virginia Democrat who introduced the resolution.

While the legislation has virtually no chance of being enacted, in part because it would need to be signed by Trump himself, it still allowed senators to go on the record

with their concerns about the president's public threats against Venezuela.

US naval forces are building an unusually large force, including its most advanced aircraft carrier, in the Caribbean Sea, leading many to the conclusion that Trump's intentions go beyond just intercepting cocaine-running boats.

"It's really an open secret that this is much more about potential regime change," said Senator Adam Schiff, a California Democrat who also

pushed the resolution. "If that's where the administration is headed, if that's what we're risking -- involvement in a war -- then Congress needs to be heard on this."

Push for congressional oversight

As the Trump administration has reconfigured US priorities overseas, there has been a growing sense of frustration among lawmakers, including some Republicans, who are concerned about recent moves made by the

Pentagon.

At a hearing in the Senate Armed Services Committee earlier Thursday, Senator Roger Wicker, the Republican chair, said that many senators have "serious concerns about the Pentagon's policy office" and that Congress was not being consulted on recent actions like putting a pause on Ukraine security assistance, reducing the number of US troops in Romania and the formulation of the National Defence Strategy.

GOP senators have direct-

ed their ire at the Department of Defence's policy office, which is led by Elbridge Colby, an official who has advocated for the US to step down its involvement in international alliances.

"It just seems like there's this pigpen-like mess coming out of the policy shop," said Senator Tom Cotton, an Arkansas Republican who chairs the Senate Intelligence Committee, during another armed services hearing earlier this week.

As pushback has mounted

on Capitol Hill, the Trump administration has stepped up its briefings on the campaign in the Caribbean, including sending both Secretary of State Marco Rubio and Defence Secretary Pete Hegseth to a classified briefing on Wednesday for congressional leaders on the strikes against vessels.

The officials gave details on the intelligence that is used to target the boats and allowed senators to review the legal rationale for the attacks, but did not discuss whether they would launch an attack directly against Venezuela, according to lawmakers in the meeting.

Still, Democrats, joined by Republican Senator Rand Paul, have pushed into the potential for an attack on Venezuela under the War Powers Resolution of 1973, which was intended to reassert congressional power over the declaration of war.

A previous war powers vote pertaining to the strikes against boats in international waters failed last month on a 48-51 vote, but Kaine said he was hoping to peel off more Republicans with a resolution that only pertains to attacks on Venezuela.

Some Republicans uneasy with campaign

The Republican leadership

was pressing Thursday to make sure the legislation failed, and many GOP senators have expressed support for Trump's campaign, which has killed at least 66 people in 16 known strikes.

Senator Lindsey Graham, a South Carolina Republican who is a Trump ally, argued in a floor speech that the War Powers Act gave lawmakers too much power over military decisions and that Congress has other means to check the president's decisions.

"I like the idea that our commander-in-chief is telling narco-terrorist organisations you're not only a foreign terrorist organisation, but when you engage in threats to our country -- a boat headed to America full of drugs -- we're going to take you out," Graham said. But there were still several senators carefully considering their vote.

Just hours before the vote, Republican Senator Susan Collins of Maine said she had carefully read over the Trump administration's secret legal opinion on the strikes, but had not reached a decision. "It remains a difficult decision," she said.

Senator Thom Tillis, a North Carolina Republican, said he would vote against the resolution, but added that he has had his doubts about the campaign.

World leaders gather in Brazil

As world leaders head to a second day of climate talks being hosted in Brazil, a major proposal to protect tropical forests worldwide is sure to be a major topic of discussion.

Brazil's President Luiz Inácio Lula da Silva on Thursday sought to mobilise funding to halt the ongoing destruction of tropical rainforests and advance the many unmet promises made at previous summits.

He's proposing a fund called the Tropical Forests Forever Facility that would pay 74 developing countries to keep their trees standing, using loans from wealthier nations and commercial investors.

Financed by interest-bearing debt instead of donations, it aims to make it more lucrative for governments to keep their



trees rather than cut them down. The location where the proposal was announced and the talks are being held, Belem, is significant because the city is part of the Amazon rainforest, which is crucial in helping to regulate the climate.

Destroying rainforests makes money for cattle ranchers, miners and illegal loggers, but Brazil hopes to convince countries that preserving forests promises richer rewards for

the entire world by absorbing huge amounts of carbon dioxide, a greenhouse gas that heats the planet when it's released into the atmosphere.

As senior Brazilian officials walked reporters through the fund's inner workings, Norway pledged \$3 billion -- the biggest commitment of the day -- raising hopes for Lula's ambitions to become a reality.

Pakistan presents evidence-based demands to end cross-border terrorism

Islamabad

Pakistan on Friday said that it has handed over "evidence-based" and "logical demands" to the mediators -- Turkiye and Qatar -- during the third round of peace talks being held in Istanbul with the Afghan Taliban regime.

Pakistan and the Afghan Taliban resumed the third round of talks in Istanbul on Thursday to tackle the issue of cross-border terrorism and avoid further escalation between the two sides.

Foreign Office Spokesperson Tahir Hussain Andrabi said that talks with the Afghan Taliban regime commenced in Istanbul on Thursday in the presence and with the participation of mediators. "The Pakistan delegation has handed over its evidence-based, justified,



and logical demands to the mediators with a singular aim to put an end to cross-border terrorism," Andrabi said while addressing his weekly media briefing here.

"The mediators fully endorsed Pakistan's stance on the basis of evidence pro-

vided by our side, as well as the tenets of international law and principles," he said, adding that the mediators were discussing Pakistan's demands point by point with the Afghan delegation.

Andrabi said any other information being circulated on social media, particularly from Afghan handlers or Afghan accounts, is either pure speculation or deliberate disinformation.

He also said that Pakistan's demand to the Afghan Taliban

regime was simple: that it should stop the infiltrators from operating from Afghan soil.

The third round of talks had begun in Istanbul to defuse tension between Islamabad and Kabul that erupted in an open border conflict last month.

Earlier, the two sides failed to agree on the contentious issues during the two rounds of talks held on October 19 in Doha and October 25 in Istanbul.
